City recognized for sustainability initiatives

The city manager's office sent out the City Manager's Newsletter last Friday. The full newsletter can be found by going to concordnh.gov and clicking the "Newsletter" button. Here are some highlights:

City meetings

City meetings are held in person in Council Chambers at 37 Green St. (unless otherwise specified on the City's calendar). Upcoming meetings include:

Tree Planting

Protecting drinking water begins at the source. In many cases, planting native trees and shrubs along shorelines can improve bank stability, dissipate flood waters, trap excess nutrients, and in turn, re-

sult in cleaner water for millions downstream. MRWC recently received federal funding to complete landscape-scale restoration projects throughout the Merrimack River Watershed, and planting trees tops the list. Join other community volunteers to get your hands dirty to improve the health of your local watershed!

For this event, trees will be planted along the Merrimack River just north of the city. The site is actively utilized for agriculture, and the enhanced tree buffer will further reduce runoff, critical to protect the river as a backup drinking water source for city residents.

Municipal Energy Champion Award

The City of Concord has been recognized for its longstanding sustainability, environmental and energy initiatives this month as a recipient of the Municipal Energy Champion Award.

The award was presented to the city during New Hampshire Energy Week, which began on April 11, 2022. New Hampshire Energy Week is a series of annual events that highlights prominent energy topics and issues, provides a forum to examine energy solutions, and brings leading experts together to share perspectives and knowledge.

The Concord City Council unanimously adopted a resolution supporting the goal of 100% renewable energy in 2018, the City of Concord has been aggressively moving toward developing clean energy sources in all

elements of City operations. The 100% Renewable energy resolution states that:

"It is the goal of the City of Concord that 100% of electricity consumed in the City will come from renewable energy sources by 2030, 100% of thermal energy (heating and cooling) consumed in the City will come from renewable sources by 2050, and 100% of transportation used in the City will be clean transportation by 2050. This goal

will apply to the entire Concord community, not just municipal government operations."

Concord is working to deploy at least 4MW of solar generation on city properties, and priority areas include a capped landfill and the Hall Street Wastewater facility.

In addition, the city is currently nearing completion on the replacement of all 2,100 streetlights with high efficiency LED lights. The

Spring leaf collection

The City of Concord's Spring Leaf Collection started April 25. Concord residents with curbside trash collection can participate by placing leaves at the curb by 7 a.m. on their scheduled trash day. All leaves must be in biodegradable yard waste bags and/or rigid containers labeled for leaves.

Leaves raked loosely to the curb are only collected during the City's Fall Leaf Collection. In the spring, leaves must be bagged or contained for easy pick-up with trash collection. Unacceptable materials will not be collected, including

branches, brush, and the use of plastic bags.

Leaf collection will continue for six weeks in coordination with trash collection through Saturday, June 4. The last week of collection will be delayed by one day with no trash or leaf collection May 30 due to the Memorial Day holiday.

Residents can also bring leaves to Gelinas Excavation & Earth Materials Recycling Center at 10 Intervale Road, off of Fort Eddy Road. Drop-off is free with proof of residency. Residents will be required to empty contents at the facility to confirm that loads are 100% free of any unacceptable materials. Any container used to transport leaves to the earth recycling center must be taken back with the resident; bags are not required for drop-off.

Gelinas Excavation & Earth Materials Recycling Center is open with temporary reduced hours of 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday through Friday. Saturday hours are available during leaf collection from 8 a.m.

to 12 p.m. through June 4, with the exception of Memorial Day weekend when the facility will be closed on May 28. Hours are weather dependent and

are subject to change. It is advised to call the recycling center to confirm available drop-off times at (603) 545-4835.




book of the week

The Hummingbirds' Gift: Wonder, Beauty, and Renewal on Wings

By Sy Montgomery
(83 pages, nonfiction, 2021)

New Hampshire Author Sy Montgomery goes to California to help bird rescuer Brenda Sherburn LaBelle raise two tiny baby hummingbirds. Brenda is a bird rehabilitator and she is an expert at hummingbird rescue and care. She's planted a hummingbird garden around their California home and she gets calls from all over about how to care for hummingbirds. The two babies are really tiny – the size of peanuts! Brenda and Sy have to use magnifying glasses to get a good look at them. The babies must be fed fruit flies by hand every twenty minutes during the day. Everything in Brenda and Sy's life revolves around feeding these tiny creatures every twenty minutes. They are afraid to name them at first in case the babies don't make it, but eventually, Sy suggests the names of Maya and Zuni.



The babies have some setbacks – they have mites. And removing the mites is traumatic for everyone. This is a small book, but it is filled with information about hummingbirds, and it has some beautiful photos. I was impressed with the dedication and determination of all those who work to rehabilitate a hummingbird, “a breathing gem.” Sy Montgomery writes, “though tiny and fragile, hummingbirds, like no other birds, own the sky.”



history

May 5, 1944: An epidemic of German measles in Concord has driven the absentee list at city schools above 100.

May 6, 2003: Gov. Craig Benson appoints a 12-person task force to determine whether the Old Man of the Mountain should be reborn as a plaster of Paris,

rubber or granite version of its former self. Benson says the Old Man of the Mountain Revitalization Task Force will explore what should be done to best memorialize the New Hampshire icon, which fell from its Franconia Notch perch sometime last weekend.

May 6, 2000: Concord Skatepark officially opens behind Everett Arena, and about 100 skaters immediately begin sliding, ramping and jumping to their hearts' content. "A lot of kids go here, so I can learn all the moves," says Josh Meekins, a middle schooler who plans many returns. "I never could do that before."

May 6, 1967: Speaking in Manchester, Gen. Wallace Greene Jr., the top U.S. Marine, says America is winning the Vietnam War, "and I say that without any doubt whatsoever."

May 7, 1973: Maxine Kumin of Warner wins the Pulitzer Prize for poetry for *Up Country*. "I'm just absolutely knocked out," she says. "I can't believe it." Kumin says the book "took the pulse of the times a little bit. People are turning away from urban things."

May 7, 1732: John Pittman is born. He will be an early settler of Barnstead and live to the age of 101. Around his 100th birthday, a town history reports, "he procured a set of teeth, white, strong and fashionable, which was in truth a wonder in the neighbor-

hood, and he began to look young again."

May 8, 1996: Concord's South Congregational Church votes to officially welcome lesbians and gays. The measure passes, 123-26, at the congregation's 159th annual meeting. The church will now write acceptance of gays and lesbians into its bylaws.



May 9, 2001: The average cost of a gallon of gasoline in New Hampshire stands at \$1.66, but most drivers interviewed by the Monitor don't foresee changing their driving habits. "It's a numbers thing," says Linda Gi-Conte. "I think if people see it hit \$2, things might start to change."

May 9, 1944: Norman F. Whippen, New Hampshire's assistant superintendent of emergency farm labor, puts out a call for 275 "live-ins" - high school students willing to work on farms for \$30 a month plus laundry expenses.

May 10, 2001: The Boston Globe announces it will soon stop publishing its Sunday "NH Weekly" section and close its Manchester bureau. The section debuted in 1987.

May 10, 1847: Residents of Concord gather to honor Franklin Pierce after he is commissioned brigadier general for the war with Mexico. The ladies of the town present Pierce with a sword. The men have purchased a fine horse for him. When the horse suddenly dies, William Walker, proprietor of the Eagle Hotel, sells the men his black

horse, which is given to Pierce.

May 10, 1943: The state announces that liquor will now be among the commodities subject to war rationing. The limit: two quarts per person per day.

May 11, 2002: Notre Dame College celebrates its final graduation before closing its doors. The small Catholic school was founded by the Sisters of the Holy Cross 52 years earlier. Officials said financial difficulties and a declining student population forced them to close the school.

May 11, 2000: Concord schools Superintendent Curt Sokness announces he will serve the final year of his contract as principal of Walker School. He will fill in for the current principal, Clint Cogswell, who will be on sabbatical. Assistant Superintendent Chris Rath will take over for Sokness.

May 11, 1900: Norris Cotton is born. Cotton will become editor of the Granite Monthly and a lawyer in Concord before his political career. He will serve numerous terms in the New Hampshire House, including one as speaker, then go to Washington as a congressman (1947-54) and senator (1954-75).


