

Gibson hosts author, photographer Cooper

Margo Cooper visits Gibson's Bookstore, 45 S. Main St., on Feb. 20 to share her stunning new book of photographs and interviews, Deep Inside the Blues. Cooper will be joined in conversation by Holly Harris, host and producer of Spinning the Blues, a radio show airing Saturday nights on WUMB. Margo and Holly's conversation will cover the musicians in the book, the music they made, the clubs in the Boston area, (including Harper's Ferry, the original House of Blues, and Johnny D's), and the clubs, picnics, and festivals in Mississippi and Helena, Arkansas they've attended, and Margo's photographs.

Deep Inside the Blues collects Margo Cooper's interviews with blues musicians,



most born in Mississippi, and is illustrated with over 160 of her photographs, many published here for the first time. For 30 years, Cooper has been documenting the lives of blues musicians, their families and homes, neighborhoods, festivals, and gigs. Her photographic work combines iconic late-career images of many legendary figures including Bo Diddley, Honeyboy Edwards, B.B.

King, Pinetop Perkins, and Hubert Sumlin with youthful shots of Cedric Burnside and Sharde Thomas, themselves now in their thirties and forties. During this time, Burnside and Turner families and other Mississippi artists such as T-Model Ford, James "Super Chikan" Johnson, and L.C. Ulmer entered the national and international spotlight, ensuring the powerful connection between the authentic Delta, Hill Country, and Piney Woods blues musicians and their audience continues.

'A great neighborhood activity'

Tom Philbrick's basement has become something of a hockey sporting goods warehouse. Goalie equipment, sticks, skates, pucks – you name it, it's probably down there.

Oh, and don't forget about all the hockey pucks not in the basement.

"Hundreds of pucks around the neighborhood," Philbrick said. "You find pucks from 10, 15 years ago stuck. I found them on my roof, found them on my neighbor's roof. It's unbelievable."

It's a little more believable when you find out that every winter for the last two decades or so, the outdoor hockey rink in his yard in Concord's South End has held as many as 25 kids on it at once, including the entire

Concord High boys' hockey team.

Roughly 50 feet wide and 80 feet long, Philbrick's gearing up for what could be his final winter setting up the slab of ice in his yard. He acquired the boards from Concord boys' hockey coach Dunc Walsh about 18 years ago, and then held them together with rebar. A couple years later, Philbrick bought a bunch of plywood to frame the boards.

On the inside, a large sheet of plastic lines the surface like a pool. Every year around Thanksgiving, Philbrick brings out the hose, turns it on and lets it run, usually for at least three straight days. The ice needs to be thick enough to safely skate on.

The biggest challenge: getting all that water to freeze solid.

"You kind of hope you have a real cold spell where it just freezes solid because the hardest time is when it's not sturdy enough to hold you to go clear it off," Philbrick said. "You just kind of let it go until it's totally frozen, and you can get on there and people can stand on it."

Once the ice freezes, though, it's usually solid until mid-to-late March.

Maintenance of the surface also takes quite a bit of work. The rink has a tractor gate for one of Philbrick's neighbors to ride over the surface with his tractor and snowblower to clear it off. especially after big storms.

On more typical days, Philbrick will shovel the ice off after the kids skate on it. and at night, he'll run more water over the surface.

"I've had all kinds of different contraptions over the years, like hand-held Zamboni things. Now, it's basically just me out there with traditional hose and nozzle, or just free pouring right out of the hose."

For Philbrick's three kids, now 25, 22 and 19 years old, the rink has always been a

sanctuary for them and their Concord hockey teammates. Even for the kids in the neighborhood who didn't play hockey competitively, it's always been a lower-stakes way for them to try skating and shooting some pucks on net.

"It was never like hockey training camp," Philbrick said. "It was just, go out and have fun, keep the adults off

super stellar friday

McAuliffe-Shepard Discovery Center event

The McAuliffe-Shepard Discovery Center looks forward to welcoming Jacob Garside as our February 2024 Super Stellar Friday speaker. Jacob is currently a secondyear student at Plymouth State University here in New Hampshire, pursuing a B.S. in Meteorology. He has been a part of the Nationwide Eclipse Ballooning Project since 2022. He was also a NASA Space Grant intern at the Discovery Center during the summer of 2023, and his

campers are well prepared for what the atmosphere is doing. the April 8 eclipse.

During his presentation, Jacob will teach us all about solar eclipses and the Nationwide Eclipse Ballooning Project. These phenomena have puzzled humans for over ten thousand years, with most ancient cultures believing them to be the work of angry gods. Nowadays we can use science to figure out what's going on during solar eclipses, and can even use meteorology to gain a better insight into exactly

The goal of the Nationwide Eclipse Ballooning Project is to create a high-resolution data set using weather balloon data collected during solar eclipses in 2023 and 2024. Using data taken in 2023, we can analyze and predict what the April 8 eclipse will look like. Jacob's talk on this subject will take place on Feb. 2, and doors will open at 6:30 p.m. with the presentation beginning at 7 p.m.

Super Stellar Friday is a monthly event hosted by the McAuliffe-Shepard Discovery Center. Along with a guest speaker presentation, attendees can look forward to exploring the exhibits, watching our popular planetarium show, Tonight's Sky, and weather allowing, look at the stars with New Hampshire Astronomical Society.

Feb. 1, 2003: News spreads through Concord that the space shuttle Columbia has exploded, reminding many of the space shuttle Challenger. 

book of the week

'Annihilation,' by Jeff VanderMeer

(2014, 195 pages, Genre: Science Fiction / Horror)

"'The map had been the first form of misdirection, for what is a map but a way of emphasizing some things and making other things invisible?" This is an excerpt from the journal of the biologist, the otherwise unnamed main character in Jeff VanderMeer's first installment of his Southern Reach trilogy. For over thirty years, a government agency called The Southern Reach has been sending small groups of people into a mysterious, forbidding tract of wilderness called Area X. Many of these participants have either never returned, come back with troubling psychological or physical conditions, or have killed each other while inside the borders of Area X. Stories have spread of strange new flora and fauna, and of occurrences and objects that defy explanation. The map mentioned in the biologist's journal does not account for these unsettling idiosyncrasies. Along with three other women, the biologist is part of the twelfth expedition into this abandoned landscape. Her compatriots are a surveyor, an anthropologist, and their leader, a psychologist.

The four women undergo months of grueling training

pare themselves for life in Area X. The biologist feels compelled to join the mission because her husband had been part of the eleventh

expedi-

to pre-

tion, and he, like many others, returned somehow not himself. Her once affable husband is simply a husk of his former self, and later develops terminal cancer, a fate shared by an alarming number of those returning from Area X.

Propelled by grief and a fierce need to quantify and objectively understand the type of environment that would transform her husband so dramatically, the biologist plunges into Area X, although like all other members of each expedition, she cannot recollect how she manages to breach the border or what said border was like. The biologist, the surveyor, and the anthropologist

are


vaguely aware that the psychologist hypnotized them to alleviate any fear they may have about entering this landscape. They struggle to make sense of their environment, not adequately aided by the obsolete, inadequate equipment they were provided before entering Area X. After four days of trekking across the land from the border, they discover a structure buried many feet beneath the soil. The biologist insists it is a tower, while the others call it a tunnel. After much deliberation, they decided to enter the tunnel, and begin to make their way down its winding staircase. They observe cryptic, seemingly unending text along the wall, and when the biologist leans in to get a closer look, she realizes the letters are formed from tiny, moving lifeforms. She accidentally inhales miniscule spores being released by these lifeforms, and the effects of this reverberate throughout the rest of the book.


As the group descends

further into the tower/tunnel, what they encounter and experience becomes weirder and weirder. If you've seen the incredible film adaptation of this book starring Natalie Portman, you will still find surprises in this novel, as there are quite a few details and plot points that differ greatly from the movie.
